Police Report: PC Murphy informed the CC that Scottish Police will no longer be informing us of the crime statistics for the area. We were told that if we wish these stats we must formally ask, in writing, via the Freedom of Information Act. The CC agreed that these stats were in no way a breach of data protection or any other breach of security merely guidelines as to the crime rate in the area which is why the community police attend meetings.

The Chair/secretary will get in touch with the relevant department and ask for FOIs regarding beats 31-34 which cover the CC area.

PCs Murphy and McFarlane were thanked for their attendance.

Minute of last meeting/ Matters arising:

It was noted that Mr. M Reehall was mistakenly missed from the list of attendees of the last meeting. Minutes of meeting held 25th January passed at true by M Rehall seconded by C McKechnie.

Residents were urged once again to conform to the recycling regime and recycle as much as possible as the council are facing large bills for land fill sites. It was argued though that the specifics of the items able to be recycled mean that more refuse is going into the green (landfill) bin.

Persimmon homes, the contractor responsible for the residential development at Cowglen, have been contacted to ask about the housing capacity. To date no reply has been received.

The planned renovation of the Carnwadric Community Hall is due to start on Monday 7th March and should last 3-4 weeks. This renovation is in partnership with the GHA who are managing the grant.

Community Business:

Treasurer, S Lindsay, asked Bailie Docherty if she had any idea as to when the CC Grant would be given out as he has had no notification yet. We are having problems with the TSB bank regarding the change of signatories and address for statement.

Invitation to attend a meeting with our new MP Stewart McDonald on Thursday 3rd March – S. Lindsay and C. McKechnie will attend. They will be looking to bring up the subject of parking for the local train stations which is becoming a danger in the area.

Correspondence was received from Scotstoun Community Council regarding the planning application to build a 230ft high chimney servicing an 'energy-from-waste' plant in their area. They are asking for our support in bringing concerns to our councillors regarding this. Bailie Docherty is presently looking into this matter and is hoping to gain more information before making a decision. A meeting is scheduled with WH Malcolm and objectors.

Councillors' Update:

Bailie Docherty: Attended the event held in Thorntree Hall by SEPA regarding recently built and proposed flood risk management strategy. Detailed maps were available to look at. New flood preventions in the Kennishead and Cathcart areas are backed by a letter which is available to residents to forward to their insurers which should reduce insurance bills. These will be made available for the next meeting. The roads department have been inundated with complaints again regarding pot holes. Potholes in the area are becoming larger and dangerous to both pedestrians and drivers.
