

Crochet Fidget Toy **PATTERN**

Materials:

Worsted weight yarn in
2 contrasting colours

5mm Crochet hook

Marble

Yarn needle

Scissors

Abbreviations:

Chain: ch

Stitch: st

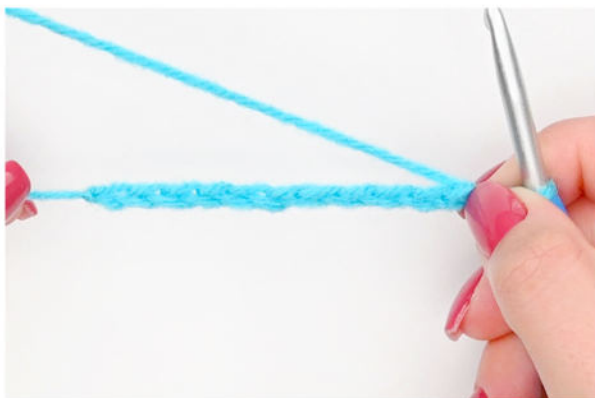
Half-double crochet(s): hdc(s)

Slip stitch: ss

Pattern Notes:

- 1** The pattern photos show how to make a small fidget toy (3-1/4" square). The steps to making a large one (5-1/2" by 4-3/4") are very similar. You just need to change the number of starting chains, rows, and the number of sewn in lines at the end. The instructions for the large fidget are in brackets.
- 2** You can use a glass marble or a large round bead inside the fidget toy. The glass marble glides easier since it has some weight to it.

Crochet Fidget Toy



1

Start with colour A. This will be the main colour/background.

Make a slip knot and ch 11 (ch 21 for the large toy).



2

Starting from the 2nd ch from the hook, insert 1 hdc into each ch across.



3

Ch 1 and insert 1 hdc into each st across.



4

Repeat, for a total of 8 (12) rows of hdc's.



5

Repeat steps 1-4 to make a second square.
Tie in your ends.



6

Place one piece over the other, lining up the edges.



7

Begin making your border by switching to colour B and inserting your hook through both pieces at the top edge.

Ch 1 and work 1 hdc into each st across.



8

To turn the corner, insert into the last st: 1 hdc, ch 1, 1 hdc.



9

Continue inserting hdcs down the side of the pieces.



10

Turn the corner and insert hdc across the bottom.



11

Insert a marble between the pieces.



12

Hdc across the last side. When you get to the first st, insert 1 hdc into it, ch 1, and ss into the first st.



13

Starting at one side, and about 1" down from the top (or whatever distance your marble requires to fit through), sew a backstitch 2/3 of the way across.

Bring the yarn to the back and tie it off.

(On the larger fidget toy, go most of the way across, leaving just enough room for the marble to move down.)



14

Repeat to make a second line, starting on the opposite side of the square.

(For the larger toy, add a third line as well, beginning from the first side once again.)



15

Sew in all your ends.
