These individuals and organizations contributions have come in many forms from; back to school drives, providing food and supplies to individuals in need, volunteering, mentoring and coaching the youth, providing resources and supplies to the elderly, charitable contributions, raising funds to help families and students in need of financial assistance for school, providing resources during the pandemic, voter registration, and working to improve the quality of life in Uptown.

BRITTANY SMALLS

For over 10 years, Brittany Smalls has been an advocate for the city of Philadelphia. With her work in the non-profit and political fields respectively, her experience has made her a strong influence in the Uptown community. Smalls has utilized her knowledge to assist with the transformation of neighborhoods across the southwestern region of Pennsylvania.

Her past endeavors include organizing community events, hosting town hall meetings for local residents, assisting with employment retention for the constituents that received public assistance, and helps with the fight against homelessness. BERNARD A. WILLIAMS

The lower Northwest section local matriculated

through Cheltenham and Philadelphia public schools, and later college, majoring in Business Administration with a concentration in Finance. Mr. Williams was appointed by the chair of the National Young Democrats of America Black Caucus as the chair of the Pennsylvania Black Caucus of the Young Democrats of America. As his internship turned into District Coordinator for the 182nd Legislative District his political career was well on his way. from a dark place. Through the sharing of her testimony that started in the living room of her home, “Inspirational Tea With T” was born. “Inspirational Tea With T” expanded to international prayer calls, schools, youth programs, newspapers, magazines, and conferences in the efforts of others to change their perception of their narrative. In May of 2020, the Mt. Airy resident became the CEO/Founder of “BInspired Apparel Brand,” an inspirational apparel brand to inspire ALL to dream big, dream bold, and dream with expectations despite your past and your present circumstances. Gay also is the CEO of Rittenhouse Investing Group, as well as an International Speaker.

RONALD MURRAY “RON DA BARBER”

Ron Da Barber Inc, is a nonprofit organization that gives free haircuts, school supplies to children in the Northwest community. For the past 10 years, the organization has been a strong supporter of “Toys 4 Tots,” helping to collect toys in Uptown at the Stenton Manor Family home shelter. Ron’s dedicated involvement with the Uptown Vote, an organization that works to increase voter turnout, has helped in encouraging local participation in the Uptown area. The 1995 Martin Luther King High School Alumni Association President, happily volunteers his time and resources to provide assistance to Martin Luther King High School students. Ron is the proud owner of one of the few black barber schools in the state of Pennsylvania.

JOSEPH BREAD

A staple in our community and a champion for the youth of Uptown and city wide, Bread has been directly engaging the youth of the community to curb bullying, crime, and gun violence. He is the creator and CEO of Bread Factory Ent. LLC, in which he uses his platform as a promoter, entertainment manager, and motivational speaker. Joe has been a voice for the youth in Uptown primarily and citywide, he uses his platforms to mediate street rivalries and de-escalate situations within the community. Mr. Bread is an advocate for local businesses and plays an intricate part in helping raise funds for youth programming, back to school drives, and food drives throughout Uptown.

COACH OF THE YEAR

MALIK JONES

Coach Jones of Martin Luther King High School, started his impressive coaching career in 2016 as a defensive coach volunteer. Just one short year later, Jones’ defense set a Philadelphia Public League record for most interceptions in a single season. During the three-year span on defense, his team was averaging 20 interceptions per year. That little milestone boosted Jones to Defensive Coordinator, breaking multiple school records, and even made an appearance at PPL District 12 AAAAA Championship game. His tutelage landed him the position as Head Coach and ended the 2019 season to win the Philadelphia Public League District XII AAAAA Champi-

onship as well as being awarded the Philadelphia Public League Coach of the Year. Jones has coached over 20 student-athletes that have gone on to earn athletic scholarships to colleges. His impressive accomplishments have led to awards and recognitions such as a City Citation from City Councilperson Isaiah Thomas, being honored by the Philadelphia Eagles as a finalist for the Eagles’ National Coach of the Year honor for keeping players academically conscientious during the pandemic. He has also created a Cougar C.A.R.E.S. program. The program focuses on teaching off-the-field skills such as Sports Photography, Video & Editing, Graphic Design, Strength & Conditioning, Apparel Design and Creation, Athletic Training and even Coaching for the many players who will not qualify for college athletics. Currently, a former student-athlete and Team Captain is attending the University of West Virginia as part of their Media team. Other awards include the Honorable David P. Richardson Legacy Award from the office of State Rep. Stephen Kinsey.

DIRK PARKER

Ivy Hill Youth Association is one of the oldest Youth organizations in Philadelphia. Parker has spent the past 4 years working to rebuild this prestigious organization. Currently, Ivy Hill has multiple outreach programs such as Referee Mentoring Program, Youth Entrepreneurs Workshop, track, and drumline. Parker hopes to be recognized as a full and competitive organization moving out of the rebuild-

ing phase. Ivy Hill was established in 1966 and has been a pillar and safe haven in the community for many years since. Ivy Hill’s main focus has always been to use sports as a bridge to mentor the youth in the community.

DEVON JOHNSON

Head Football Coach for the Imhotep Panthers. Imhotep Charter is an African-Centered, S.T.E.M. Charter School in the Northwest section of Philadelphia. Coach Johnson had led the Panthers to the 2015 PIAA State Championship and was named 2021 PA Football News Coach of the Year.

ANDRE FALLEN

Coach Fallen is the coach as well as the Vice President and Athletics Director for Ivy Hill Youth Association. Fallen is an integral part of Ivy Hill, helping many in the uptown community through his and the Association’s sports mentoring.

EDUCATOR

DANA L. MARTIN

Dana served as College Advisor for Mastery Charter Schools, Lenfest Campus, in Philadelphia since 2009. Ms. Martin teaches a Senior Seminar course providing college prep curriculum and one-on-one guidance to high school seniors. As a member of both the National Association of College Admissions Counseling (NACAC) and its Pennsylvania counterpart (PACAC) she has presented at conferences bringing attention to college access issues affecting our youth. Dana is the author of two books, “Creatively Closing the Gap - Uncon-

ventional Ways to Find Money for College,” and “Decision Time, What to Do Next,” both books have an emphasis on college access and financial aid for families with a college wish, but little savings plan. Dana is the founder of “Get My Kid to College,” where she offers virtual group workshops, presentations, and professional development for uptown residents. She played a role in founding and co-chairing PACAC Camp College, a residential pre-college summer program serving high school students in Pennsylvania. Mrs. Martin is the recipient of the Gary Kelsey Human Relations Award 2016, Billy Penn Who's Who in Education 2017, NACAC Member Spotlight 2017, City of Philadelphia Recognition 2017, NACAC DEI Committee Recognition 2021, and has published an article in Link for Counselors in 2020. Through all the accolades, Dana's biggest accomplishment is being a change agent within her family and surrounding community. She loves making connections that make a great impact on the lives of others.

ARMOND JAMES

11 years as a Philadelphia educator, Armond James has been privileged to work with students and teachers in a variety of educational settings. Armond embodies a rock-star teaching philosophy, which inspires students with presence and wisdom. In 2017, Armond won teacher of the month in the Philadelphia School District for his dedication and commitment to his students’ academic and social well-being. Mr. James is quoted

as saying, "When I walk into the classroom I want to represent success and motivation for my students. Whether it's rigorous lessons, mentoring, style of dress, or accountability training. I believe if your students admire you and you set high standards for them they will exceed their expectations."

A graduate and proud product of the Philadelphia school system, Keisha graduated from Bodine HS for International Affairs in 1996. Keisha has been a dedicated change-agent and influencer, working for the School District of Philadelphia in several capacities including gifted education Teacher, Dean of Students, Instructional Coach, and currently, as the Principal of Martin Luther King HS. A WORLWIDE FINANCIAL CRISIS COMING- CHINA EVERGRANDE

There could be another financial crisis coming soon. This time, it would be starting in China, and it looks like it could be as big as the one we had a little over a decade ago. Suppliers who provided materials to China Evergrande to build these structures want their payment for their services.

Make no mistake, if it collapses, you going to know it. There are Chinese devel-

opers right here in the United States that have ties to Evergrande. And even worse, there are US companies who are building in China that have business relationships with Evergrande. The shares have been down well over 80% this year. Basically, a China Evergrande default on its debt will surely have some affect on the US economy. The good news is that it's possible to stop the failure of Evergrande, by giving them a bailout. China can decide to save the company, by allowing the People's Bank of China (the central

bank) to give an infusion of cash to save the company. I hope they do. We don't need to see another financial crisis, and not while we still dealing with the covid pandemic.

THE PA HOUSE PASSED LEGISLATION TO PARDON MEDICAL MARIJUANA CARDHOLDERS DUI'S

No doubt the marijuana industry continues to surpass expectations not only on the medical front but the private sector as well. As rapidly as marijuana acceptance has skyrocketed in the past few years, it's taking the law a little longer to catch up....until now.

The Pennsylvania House of Representatives has passed an amendment to pardon medical marijuana cardholders from its "zero-tolerance" policy concerning DUIs, only if it is in accordance with State Medical Cannabis Statutes.

The vote which was passed 109-93, is now on to the Senate to review and make its decision. The bill, introduced by State Representatives Chris Rabb, D-Phila., and Todd Polinchock, R-Bucks, proposes to ensure the rights of Pennsylvania's more than 500,000 medical cannabis patients, use from DUI penalties.

State Rep. Rabb said he has been contacted by many constituents, who responsibly use medical marijuana that fear that they may be targeted by law enforcement while behind the wheel. Rabb says he's an advocate for the social equality and personal liberties of medical marijuana patients, not on one's freedom to simply get high, "so long as a person's liberty doesn't infringe on their neighbors' rights." Rabb himself is a Cannabis Cardholder and understands the concern from both sides of the fence.

"Anyone, like me, who regularly uses cannabis for symptom relief will always be breaking the law when we get behind the wheel

given that traces of THC can remain in our system for up to a month," Rabb said. "As the law is written today, I could go to jail for 6 months for driving 4 weeks after swallowing a few drops of cannabis tincture sold at a dispensary licensed by the very same government that cashes in on tax revenue from the sale of medical cannabis. That's perverse. And it's also easily corrected. Our legislation will set things right."

Rabb goes on to say, "A medical cannabis user can take a minuscule amount of medicine for their ailment and weeks later, with traces of cannabis still in their system, be subject to arrest on a DUI charge if pulled over — not because they've driven impaired, but because our state laws haven't caught up with the science," Rabb continued. "And, if you think you don't know someone who falls into this

category — a person who has been prescribed medical cannabis and who drives and is fearful of the potential DUI charge they could face — you're wrong. I am a card-carrying medical cannabis patient, and I drive regularly, including in and around Philadelphia and to Harrisburg conducting the people's business."

Although marijuana use may show some negative cognitive side effects, according to the CDC, it is undetermined if the effects may impair a person, so much so, as to be classified as 'under the influence.' As of now an accurate roadside sobriety test for drug levels doesn't exist, and when a suspected driver is tested for substance use following a crash, it is shown that multiple drugs and/or alcohol are present in their system, which makes it difficult to determine which particular substance is to

blame. Especially with such inconclusive findings, it is most unfair to be subjected to such penalties if they have the legal right to the usage of marijuana in a medical capacity.

Just like prescription drugs, one must use their discretion and be responsible with how they medicate.

I am an advocate of marijuana on many levels. The rewards have proven to significantly outweigh the risks, stigmata, and propaganda against it. Whereas those who drive drunk are far more concerning and far less aware of, or concerned with, harming fellow drivers. I myself am more inclined to share the road with a weed-stoned driver looking for a snack than being exposed to an inebriated individual under the influence of far worse.

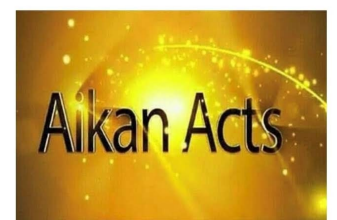
