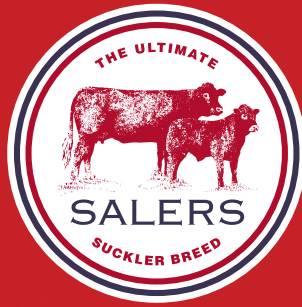

NATIONAL BEEF EVALUATIONS – MATERNAL TRAITS

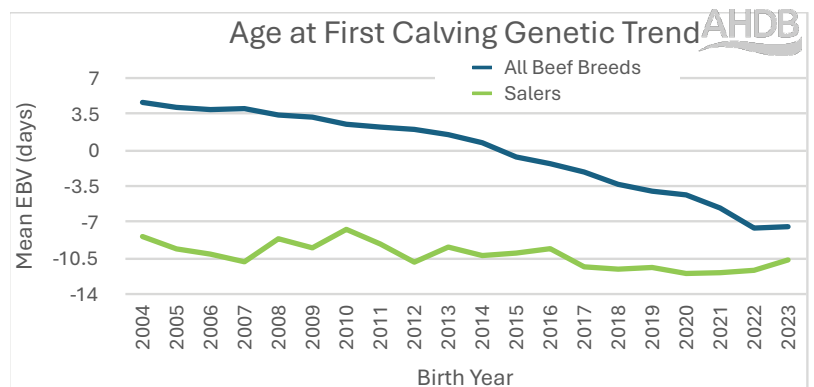
Alongside EBVs provided through BreedPlan, Saler breeders also have access to AHDB's National Beef Evaluations (NBE), which use national data from BCMS and major processors to measure genetic potential of all breeds and crossbred cattle for five carcass and three maternal traits. This means that even if you do not have a performance record, your cattle could have results through NBE.

To look up your animals in NBE, you can search directly using either an eartag or pedigree name at ahdb.org.uk/knowledge-library/national-beef-evaluations.

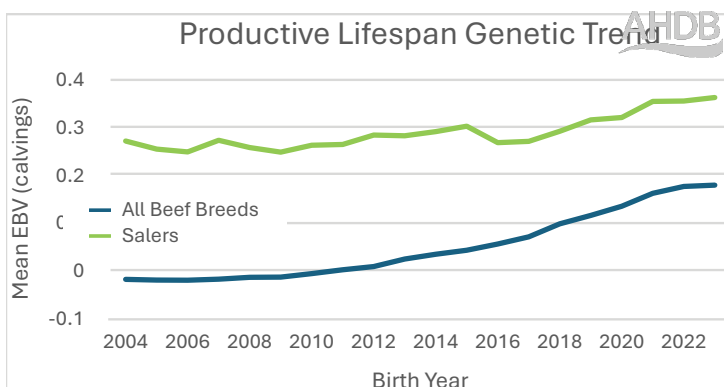
All breeds and crossbreds in NBE are comparable meaning we can track genetic trends for Salers and compare these against the national beef breed average over time.

AGE AT FIRST CALVING

Age at first calving is seen as a key metric for measuring on farm and ultimately helps towards the herds efficiency and profitability, the older the animal is after that optimal industry standard of 2 years provides a longer time frame to see the returns from the suckler cow. The trend for all beef breeds provides a steeper line demonstrating greater progress over the years; a beef heifer born in 2022 will have her first calf 12 days sooner than those born in 2004.



In contrast, Salers continue to provide a younger age at first calving (here a negative EBV, meaning a younger age, is desired) compared to the rest of the suckler beef industry. The fact less progress has been made over recent years could be in part due to Salers already performing at a level that farmers are comfortable with so less selection on genetics has been required to give the desired age at first calving outcome within the herd.



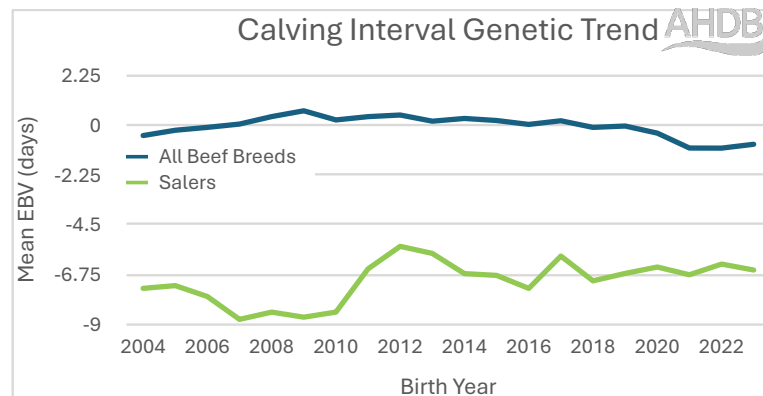
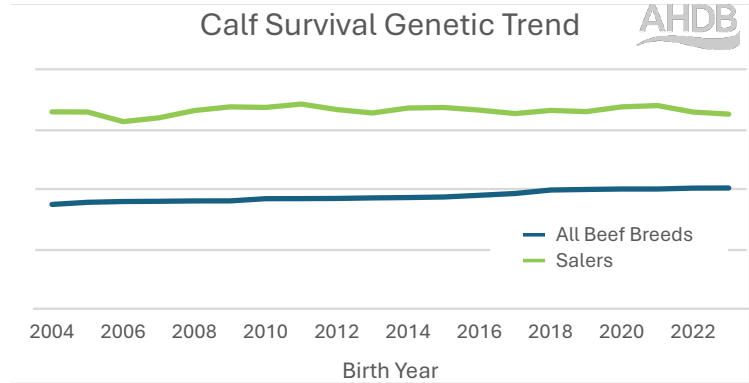
PRODUCTIVE LIFESPAN

Good cows need to not only calve early, but also go on calving for many years. We measure this longevity using the Productive Lifespan trait. This trait is measured as the number of calvings resulting in a live calf in the first 6.5 years of life or until death (whichever comes first). Selecting for productive lifespan will provide you with favourable genetics in the herd of animals that can be kept longer for breeding as well as also incorporating those animals with better fertility. So breeding animals with higher productive lifespan EBVs will increase the number of calves your cows produce in their lifetime.

The trend for all beef breeds and Salers is good, Salers born in 2022 have the genetic potential to provide 0.1 more calvings on average compared to Salers born in 2009. However, the better news story is for 2022 born Salers they will give 0.2 more calvings over their lifetime compared to the average 2022 born national beef animal. In a group of 5 animals this equates to 1 extra calf for Salers compared to other beef breeds. Again like age at first calving, Salers on average have better genetics than the national beef herd, however the rate of progress is less, meaning the gap is narrowing. Productive lifespan though is also an indirect measure of the overall health and welfare of the animal (if she is unwell, she is less likely to get in calf or live a long time), so it is always beneficial to breed from the best animals to help improve the longevity of the herd.

CALF SURVIVAL

Good maternal genetics must not only produce calves, these calves also need to grow well, with minimal losses. In NBE, calf survival measures the number of calves that survive from tagging to 10 months of age; a positive value will provide more desirable genetics and a higher likelihood of calves to survive. Unlike the previous two maternal traits in NBE, we see little genetic change in the population over the last 20 years. However, on average Salers consistently outperform, with the genetic potential to provide an additional 2 calves surviving to 10 months per 100 calves tagged compared to the national beef herd.



CALVING INTERVAL

The latest trait being added to the maternal national beef evaluation is calving interval. Whilst for Salers this shows a fluctuating trend, it has remained fairly static over the years again highlighting that Salers possess genetics to provide a shorter calving interval, helping to maintain a calving block in the herd so that it doesn't gradually become more spread out over time. This is achieved by having the genetic potential for a 6 day shorter calving interval in Salers compared to the national beef breed average in the most recent 5 year

period. Having a tighter block in the suckler herd allows for easier management of the group of cows and calves, enabling a better work-life balance for the workforce.

Overall, these trends show the Saler breed is performing above average when benchmarked against the national herd. Using Saler genetics has the ability to improve all maternal traits currently evaluated as part of NBE. To ensure the breed remains one of the best for maternal genetics, you can use EBVs as one tool for selecting the best animals to breed the next generation from to help the herd reach its full potential. The female line is also only one half of the resulting calves genetics, so it is worth checking to see if any potential new bulls have EBVs on NBE available for searching at ahdbbeef.egenes.co.uk.

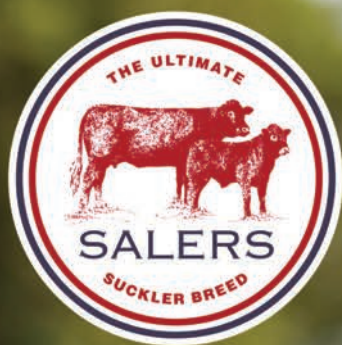

KAIMBURN ULTRA CLINCHES INTERBREED CROWN AT BORDER UNION

An outstanding example of the Salers breed took centre stage at this year's Border Union Show on Saturday 26 July 2025, as Kaimburn Ultra, exhibited by Edgerston Trading (2006) Ltd, was named Beef Interbreed Champion, in a competition kindly sponsored by Galedin Veterinary Practice.

Bred from show winning stock, Ultra is a Tibet son out of Kaimburn Precious, the celebrated Royal Highland Show Overall Champion of 2022. Judge Mathew Jordan, of The Brocks, Longhirst, praised the bull's structural quality, style, and breed character—attributes that secured him both the red

SEAWELL HERD DOMINATES SALERS AT GYS 2025

The Salers classes at the 2025 Great Yorkshire Show delivered a superb showcase—none more so than from the Seawell herd of P.M. & S.M. Donger, who enjoyed an exceptional day in the ring. Their senior bull Seawell Tabago swept to victory, first securing the Senior Bull class and Male Championship before going on to be tapped out as the Overall Breed Champion by esteemed judge Colin McClymont of the Cuil herd. Tabago a February-2023 born bull by the imported bul Impeccable, bred from homebred Seawell Orella claimed the title. Seawell stock man Neil Brown also took the coveted stockman's plaque.

A proven figure in Salers circles, Colin McClymont brought his considerable experience and discerning eye to the ring, praising the strength and depth of the entries and the quality of the top-end cattle. He described the champion as “a powerful, correct bull with tremendous breed character and presence—he’s the type of Salers we should be aiming to breed.”

It was a day of dominance for Seawell genetics, with the herd also producing the Female Champion in Seawell Raja, who had earlier taken the Cow Class. The Inka sired April-2020 born cow later stood as

Reserve Overall Champion, reinforcing the consistency and breeding within the herd. Her balance, femininity, and maternal strength saw her standout in a very competitive female line-up.

In the junior section, another Impeccable sired bull this time bred from Seawell Opal, Seawell Understudy, continued the herd’s winning streak, being awarded Junior Male Champion and ultimately rising to claim the Overall Junior Championship.

But Seawell were not alone in the spotlight. Approach Farm Utopia, a Drumsleed Ricardo daughter, made a notable impression in the heifer lines, securing the Junior Heifer championship title and going on to stand as Overall Reserve Junior Champion.
