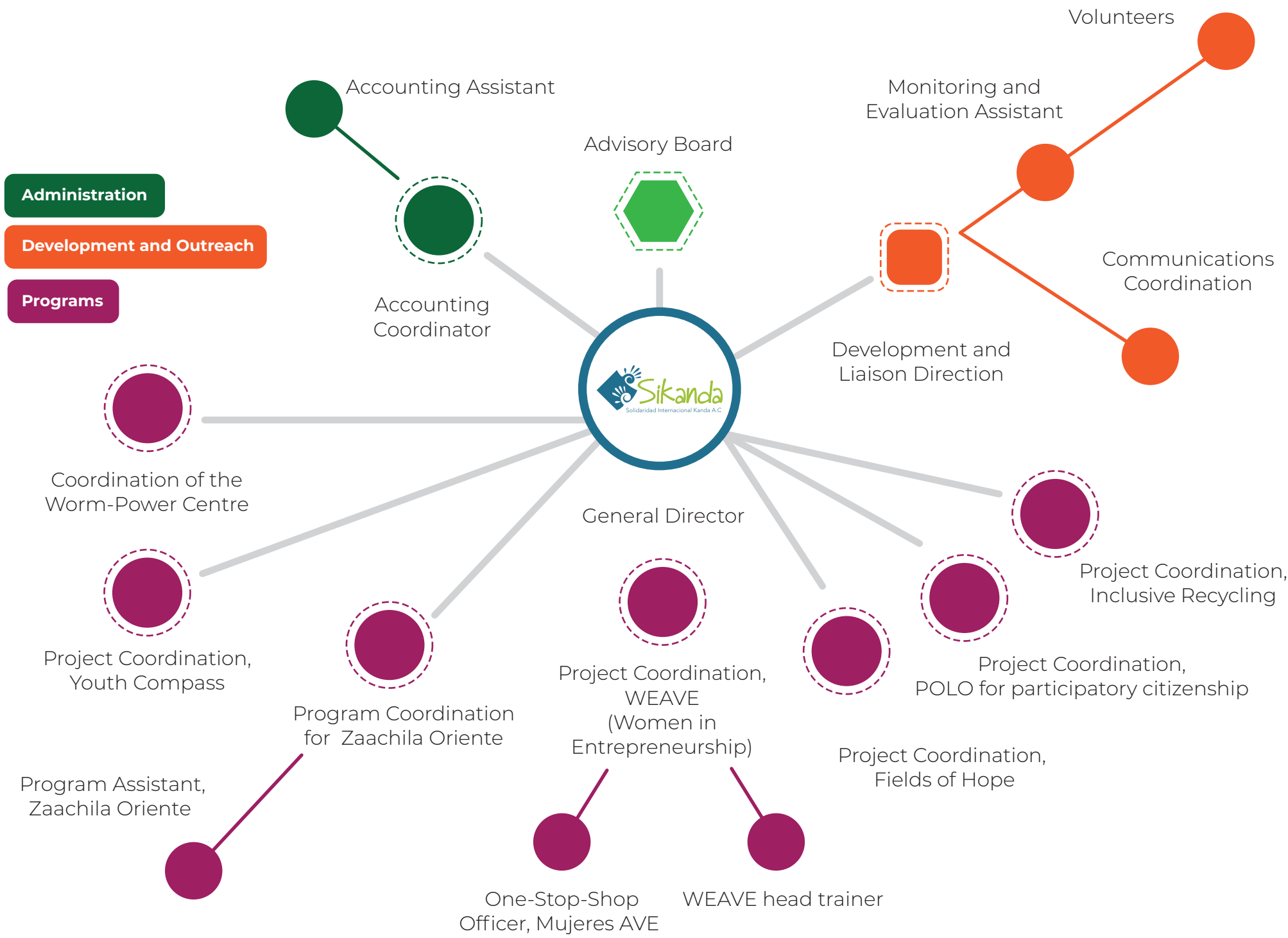

WHERE DO WE WORK?



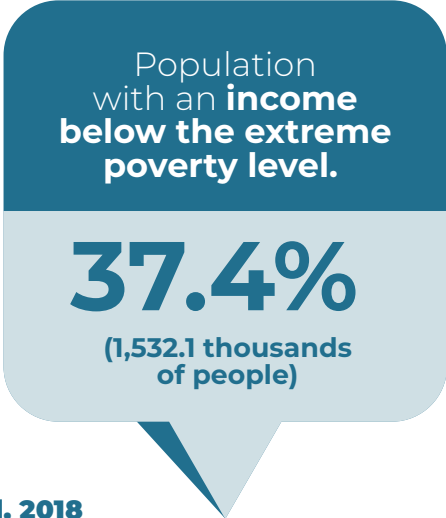
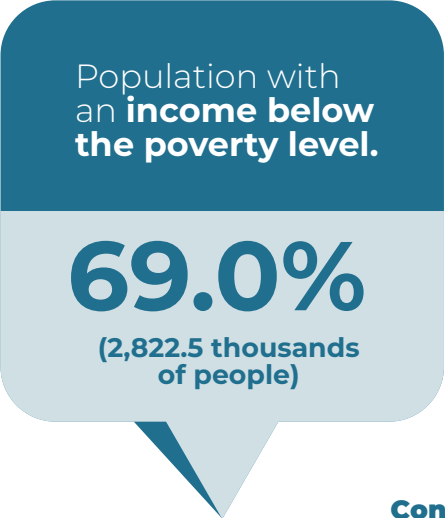
We work in the area that surrounds the **largest dumpsite in Oaxaca, Mexico**. A place where the institutional abandonment, poverty and marginalization impede the exercise of human rights for over 15,000 people inhabiting the surrounding area. This zone receives between 700 and 1,000 tons of trash daily from the capital city and 22 metropolitan area municipalities.



We also implement projects in the municipalities of **Huajuapán de León, San Lorenzo Cacaotepec and the Papaloapan region** in Oaxaca. Besides this, we work in alliance with organizations in the states of **Puebla, Guerrero and San Luis Potosí**.

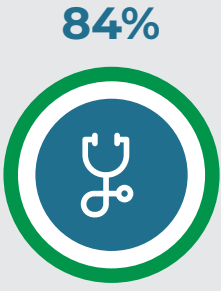

Educational lagging.



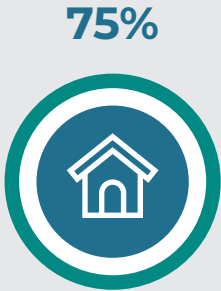

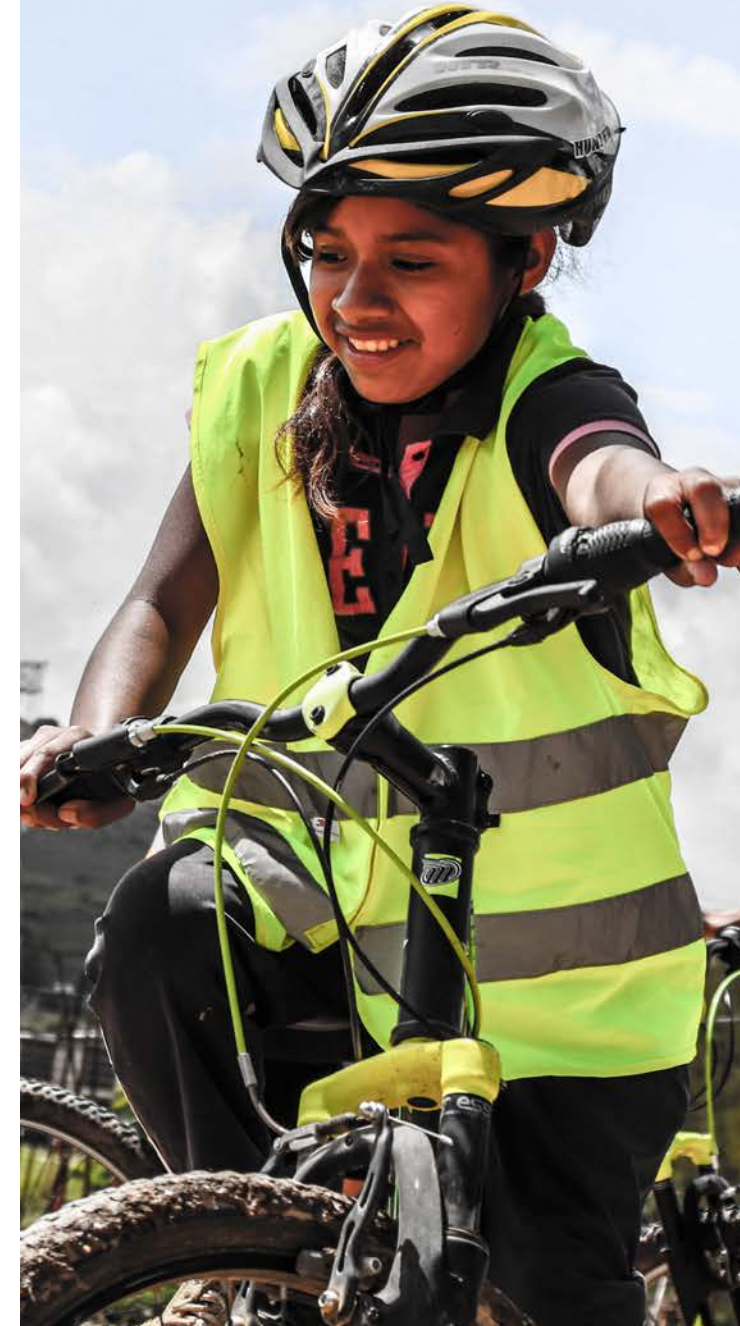

PROJECT

Dignified and Productive Inclusive Recycling in Oaxaca

General Objective:

Promoting the recognition of the rights of Informal Recyclers, their organization, and inclusion in municipal waste management systems.



2019-2020 Results:

- Acquisition of **2 vehicles to implement Recycling Routes** directly operated by recyclers in the municipalities of Huajuapán de León and San Lorenzo Cacaotepec, Oaxaca.
- Acquisition of **2 plastic pulverizers** to generate added value and reduce the volume of waste in the landfills of Huajuapán de León and San Lorenzo Cacaotepec, Oaxaca.
- **80 recyclers trained** to identify different types of plastic to pulverize. Ensuring proper understanding of technical processes for handling as well as preventive and safety maintenance of plastic pulverizers.

SUSTAINABLE HABITAT



PROJECT

Worm Power Centre

General Objective:

To promote environmental education for waste management, composting, food gardens, urban agriculture and eco-friendly techniques. To encourage urban agriculture and worm composting with our friends, the red Californian worms.



2019-2020 Results:

- Processing of **10 tons of organic waste**, producing over **2 tons of worm compost** at the Worm Power Centre.
- **1,461,519 views** in our YouTube channel, **3,042 new subscriptions** as well as **25,274 hours of watchtime** about worm compost as an effective method to separate and diminish organic waste from home.
- Creation of the “Worm Composting community” through a Facebook group where **115 people** discuss worm compost.

COMMUNITIES IN MOTION



PROJECT

POLO for participatory citizenship

General Objective:

To contribute to democratic governance and social development as well as inclusive growth by strengthening organizational capabilities of civil society.



2019-2020 Results:

- Strengthening the capabilities of **60 organizations of civil society** in Puebla, Guerrero and Oaxaca regarding administrative proficiency and fundraising via virtual workshops.
- Operative and financial support for civil society organizations of the Polo Network, for the creation of **8 virtual centers for educational support** for girls, boys, and adolescents during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Dialogue forum with **120 university students**, civil society organizations and government representatives from the regions of Valles Centrales and Mixteca, to **identify needs as well as development strategies for Oaxaca.**



PROJECT

Fields of Hope

General Objective:

Prevent child labor and promote the improvement of work conditions in migrant agricultural communities in Oaxaca and Veracruz in the coffee and sugar cane sectors.



2019-2020 Results:

- **45 people were certified on** strategies to improve the wellbeing of children in basic education, in coordination with World Vision Mexico, the Oaxaca Public Education Institute, the Human Rights Ombudsperson in Oaxaca, the Autonomous University of Oaxaca as well as the Children and Adolescents Rights Bureau.
- **1,000 social service workers** on the state and municipal level have been trained on strengthening the institutional capabilities for the detection and attention of child labor.



PROJECT

Empowering for Community Health

General Objective:

To improve community health in eastern Zaachila, Oaxaca, through a public health and participatory approach.



2019-2020 Results:

- Elaboration of a diagnosis of the nutritional state of 287 children from 3 public elementary schools based on the analysis of anthropometric tests, clinical observation and participatory workshops.
- Participation of **528 people** -between childhood, adolescence, and adulthood- to prepare, maintain and care for school gardens located in 4 elementary schools and 1 middle school.



**VISIBLE
YOUTH**



PROJECT

Promoting Youth Communities

General Objective:

Strengthen the participation and leadership of youth in their community to develop a culture of peace as well as the recognition of their rights and their role as change-makers.



2019-2020 Results:

- Elaboration of contextualized reports about **sexual and reproductive rights** based on the reflections of **92 youth** regarding this subject.
- Realization of **3 community events** about the recognition of gender equity with the participation of 319 youth.
- **44 youth** participated in volunteer community actions.



PROJECT

Girls on Bikes

General Objective:

Promote autonomy and mobility, primarily in female adolescents, through the use of bicycles as a tool to promote gender equity.



2019-2020 Results:

- A group of **28 Girls** received a **bicycle** as well as a cycling and basic mechanics workshops.
- **5 community sessions** of physical and emotional self-care with participants from 5 generations.
- There were **4 cycling trips** between women to strengthen leadership, self-esteem and protection of one another.

PROJECT

Prevail

General Objective:

Strengthen protection factors for violence prevention at an individual, group, and community level for girls, adolescents and women, through playful activities such as telling stories.



2019-2020 Results:

- **146 children** between the ages of 10 to 12 participated in sessions to identify risk factors of sexual violence.
- **3 intergenerational sessions** between youth and adults to share violence prevention strategies.
- **178 mothers** participate in workshops to understand changes through puberty.

PROJECT

WEAVE: Women in Entrepreneurship: Acting, Linking and Empowering

General Objective:

Strengthen small businesses and women support networks who live in the east areas of the Municipality of Villa de Zaachila, with a gender and social economy approach.



2019-2020 Results:

- Restart of trainings and beginning of workshops regarding customer service, sales, sales pitch, and commercialization in social media.
- The group formed by **47 women** is more consolidated, united, and has common growth goals.
- The participants have new spaces for the sale of their products including a new online platform, **23 social media accounts, and 2 commercial agreements** with local brands.



**#STAYHOME
SOLIDARITY**



The contingency generated from COVID-19 continues to gravely affect food access and the economic situation of people who cannot work from home. Those who live in the areas surrounding the landfills or work in waste management face particular risks.

We decided to transform the sanitary emergency into a solidarity emergence, thus we solicit support so that the most vulnerable families can protect themselves without endangering their daily nourishment.

This is how the **#StayHomeSolidarity** campaign arose in march 2020. It is an emergent program that initially planned support for 130 families. However, the program has amassed a total of **731 nutritional kits** that have been distributed throughout the course of four months. Each family also receives a guided nutrition and public health service.

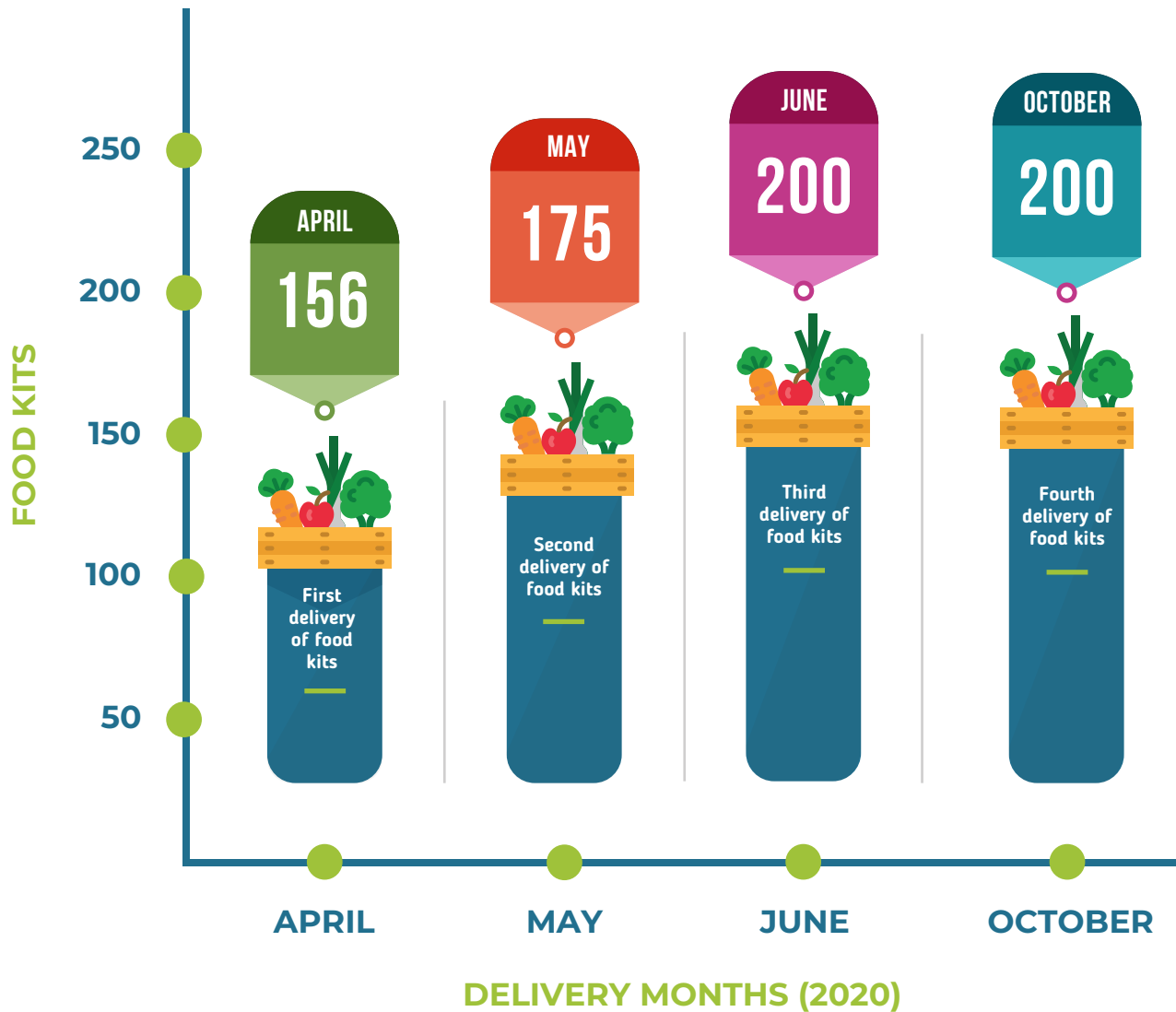
Each food basket was delivered due to special logistics as well as a lot of teamwork from the SiKanda and allied organizations inside and outside of Oaxaca.

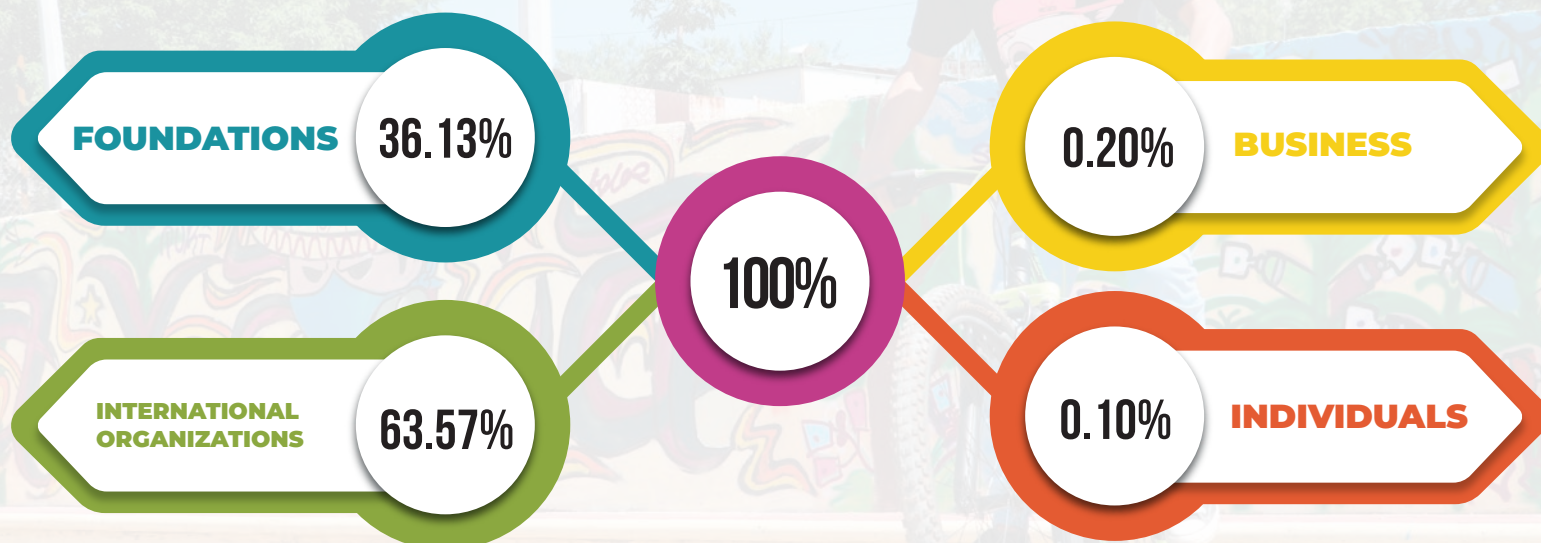
