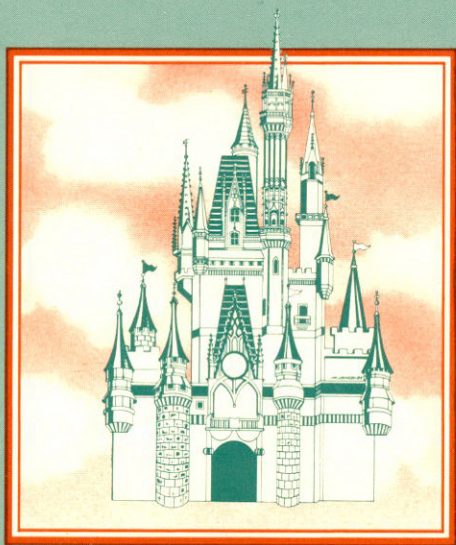

This course will aid the pediatrician and family practitioner in dealing with gynecologic problems unique to girls from early puberty through maturity. Emotional problems secondary to hormonal changes of puberty will be

discussed as well as the girl who, when grown, will be unusually short or tall. Hirsutism beginning in puberty can also emotionally devastate a young girl and will be covered. Type I (insulin dependent) diabetes mellitus often begins in early puberty and its management is made more difficult by the sexual hormonal changes as well as the emotional liability and immature attitudes of adolescents.
