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INTRODUCTION

Church History

The following is taken from a leaflet available at the church.

The parish church of Hillingdon, dedicated to Saint John the Baptist, stands at the top of Hillingdon Hill at its junction with Royal Lane. It is built of flint with bath stone dressings and, like many old buildings, has been altered and enlarged over the centuries to meet the changing needs of the parish.

The earliest written reference to a church in Hillingdon is the grant by Brian Fitz Count, Lord of Colham Manor, of Hillingdon Church to Evesham Abbey shortly after 1100. Nothing remains of that building.

The earliest part of the present building is acknowledged to be the chancel arch, dated around 1270. The western three bays of the nave and north and south aisles are dated mid-14th century, with the south aisle thought to be the earlier of the two aisles. The tower was built in 1629 to replace a medieval one taken down in 1623 because it was "ruinous." It is embattled, of three stages, with a cupola containing a bell, and topped by a weather vane. The cupola is made of oak and is supported on six octagonal columns. The tower contains a peal of ten bells.

By the 1840s it was agreed that the church was not large enough to accommodate the growing local population (in 1847, it could seat about 600 people) and Mr (later Sir) George Gilbert Scott, a young architect, was appointed to report and advise. His report, dated 22 October 1846, recommended pulling down the existing chancel and extending the church eastwards, and adding north and south transepts. The extension was built in 1848-49 by Messrs. James Fassnidge of Uxbridge. The organ chamber was built alongside the south side of the chancel in 1887.

Major restoration was again undertaken in 1902. Dormer windows, removed in the 1848-9 rebuilding, were replaced in the roof of the nave and in the new part of the north aisle, and the chancel arch was raised in height by 4 feet 6 inches, thought to be more in keeping with the dimensions of the chancel. The gallery under the tower was removed in 1906 and tower repairs carried out in 1911 and again in 1981-6.

The east end of the north aisle was remodelled as a memorial chapel to the fallen of the First World war in 1922, and the war memorial was brought inside the church from its previous position on the outside of the north wall.

In 1964 a new vestry block, designed by Norman Haines, was built to the north east of the church. The latest development came in 2012 when the coffee bar area was added in the South Aisle and the altar platform was removed.

The church has many interesting memorials; the one that is most celebrated is also its oldest. At location CH50 there is a handsome brass relief carving on a slab of marble.

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A notice adjacent to the slab explains that the slab was once the lid to a tomb made in 1509, and which once contained John, 8th Lord Strange, Baron of Knokyn and Jacquetta his wife. Jacquetta was the sister of Elizabeth Woodville, Queen of Edward IV, and mother of the princes in the Tower.

The Churchyard

The church has always been surrounded by a graveyard for the burial of the dead. Burial registers have recorded all the burials since 1559. By 1819 the churchyard had become full and it was enlarged by incorporating part of Coney Green on the south side. It became full again in 1867 when it was closed to burials in new graves, while burials were allowed to continue for family members in existing graves. The last such burial took place in 1948.

The sizeable churchyard contains 600 memorials including many substantial and impressive chest tombs, however brambles, and particularly ivy, had grown into many of these and caused considerable damage to them. From the start of 2019 a group of 10 volunteers from the congregation began to meet weekly to remove the brambles, ivy, and self-seeded elder that had caused this damage, and when it was possible to do so the broken stones were glued back together, and tombs were rebuilt. Consequently at the time of the 2019 survey, in the summer months, the churchyard was in a clear state, and all the tombs were accessible.

The churchyard includes 12 gravestones dating back to the 17th century. The oldest of these is the grave at location D82 for Bartholomew Pearce of Woxbridge (the ancient name for Uxbridge) who died in 1673; and the next oldest is at location D96 for William Webb, also of Woxbridge, who died in 1677. These two are both described as the top of a chest tomb now laid flat. The churchyard includes many stones like these. They appear at first site to be well carved ledger stones, lying flat on the ground, but they have shaped rounded edges indicating that they were most likely the tops of chest tombs, presumably damaged in the past, and now with their sides removed.

Many of the gravestones have an interesting story to tell. There is an elaborate chest tomb which once had pillars at location B69 for Thomas Harris (1739-1820) who was a patentee of Covent Garden Theatre. There is an area in Section D including graves D67, D68, D83, D86 and D94 all of which commemorate distinguished apothecaries, several of them appointed to monarchs.

One tomb that stands out to the visitor is that of Vice Admiral Sir James Nicoll Morris, for the tomb (A71) is seen well embedded into the wall of the church, with a neatly constructed archway framing the stone and supporting the wall above. The wall was part of the 1848-49 rebuilding of the church, whereas Sir James Nicoll Morris had been buried in his grave from 1830, so in his case he had been allowed to rest in peace while the church was built around him.

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On a first look round the churchyard it became clear that there were several footstones on their own. Footstones typically include just the initials of the deceased, and the year of death, so do not convey much information, but they certainly testify that there will have been a matching headstone there at one time, so all footstones with a legible inscription were duly recorded, and this turned up a couple of strange and unexpected cases. At locations A7 and A8, which are headstones and footstones, the footstones are lined up with the wrong headstones, difficult to see how that may have occurred. And then in section B it happens again. The footstones for graves B205 and B206 are also swapped over.

The Memorial Surveys

Prior to 2019 there had been a survey of all the memorials in the churchyard at St. John's, undertaken from July to October 1980 by a group of some 20 volunteers, most of whom were members of West Middlesex Family History Society. Notes attached to this report say that the work of transcribing would start on 12th July 1980, and that two or three visits would probably be necessary! The report also mentions "The teams then worked through the tangled area at the back ...", rather implying that some ledger stones could have been missed.

With so many volunteers working in some haste there was some cutting of corners in this report. It does not include any descriptions of the memorials, nor does it contain any layout to help locate a memorial. The instructions to volunteers also included the observation: "You can ignore verses from the Bible or the more obvious conventional gravestone phrases", so the end result was a comprehensive list of each memorial, providing details of each death, and the relationships as found in the inscriptions, but it was not by any means a word for word record of what had been inscribed.

This work was typed into a report, which was signed by Vic Gale of West Middlesex Family History Society, and dated February 1984.

The 2019 survey was undertaken after Christine Bartlett from St. John's had set herself the task of identifying the location of each inscription listed in the 1984 document. She soon found that she was identifying quite a few memorials that had not been recorded in 1980 at all, and it was then that she made contact with West Middlesex Family History Society, and the 2019 survey began. No large teams of volunteers this time around, but the regular team of Yvonne Masson and Roland Bostock, who made many visits during the summer months aiming to capture as much of the full inscriptions as could still be read. Christine provided support throughout, including frequent cups of tea for Yvonne. Brian Page from the Society also lent a helping hand. On counting the numbers, the 1980 survey reported on 523 graves in the churchyard, but in 2019 a further 86 graves were found and recorded.

During the survey Christine provided copy of a much earlier listing of the gravestones, taken in 1789, from a document held at Uxbridge library. Again, this document contained details of the deceased, but it did not contain the actual inscriptions. The list referenced 99 memorials, 70 of which could be matched to those found in this

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survey. In the few cases where information has been taken from either this list, or the 1980 survey, a note has been added to the record produced in this report.

GLOSSARY

The following glossary refers to some of the terms used in the descriptions of the memorials.

Altar tomb

A raised tomb, generally with a flat top, with panelled sides.

Body stone

A flat stone covering the length of a grave, when there is also a headstone (see also Ledger).

Brick tomb

A raised tomb formed of bricks with a flat stone on top.

Celtic cross

Crosses come in all shapes and forms. The Celtic cross is particularly common in English churchyards, and is any cross where the arms of the cross are linked by a circle of stonework.

Clubbed cross

A clubbed cross is a cross where the arms of the cross end in a clubbed shape.

Cover stone

A cover stone may be used in conjunction with a kerb to cover the main part of the grave.

Footstone

A small vertical stone marking the foot of a grave, almost always inscribed with the initials and year of death of each person buried in the grave.

Headstone

A vertical stone at the head of a grave, always inscribed, and occasionally on both sides.

Kerb

A narrow stone marking the boundary of the grave, often found with a headstone and footstone, also frequently found on its own when it will bear the memorial inscription.

Ledger

A flat stone covering the grave designed to be used without any headstone or kerb.

Obelisk

An obelisk is a tapered square column usually mounted on a plinth.

Plinth

Usually a cross is supported by means of a plinth, often with several tiers to it. A plinth is any stonework supporting further masonry. The vertical sides of a plinth are frequently used for inscriptions.

Ridged tomb

A tomb which has sloping sides to it producing a ridge along the top of the tomb.

Stepped headstone

A headstone where the top half of the stone is tapered by means of a number of steps.

Tablet

A tablet describes any essentially flat memorial that is mounted on a wall.

Tomb

Tomb is used to describe any raised memorial which covers the length of the grave.

Urn

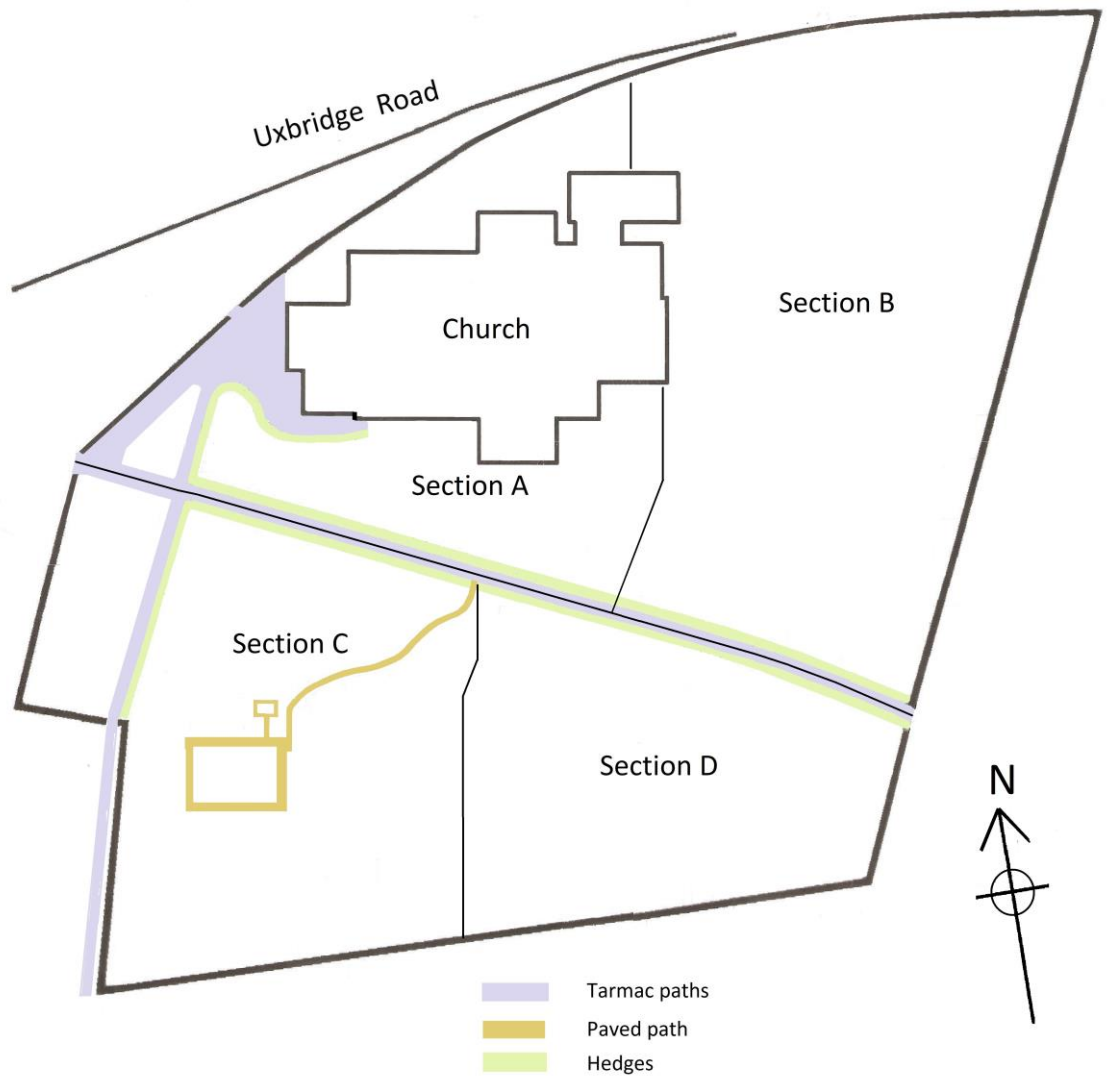
In this document an urn is used to describe any vessel on a grave that is circular in design, while vase is used otherwise.

See the description given for an urn.

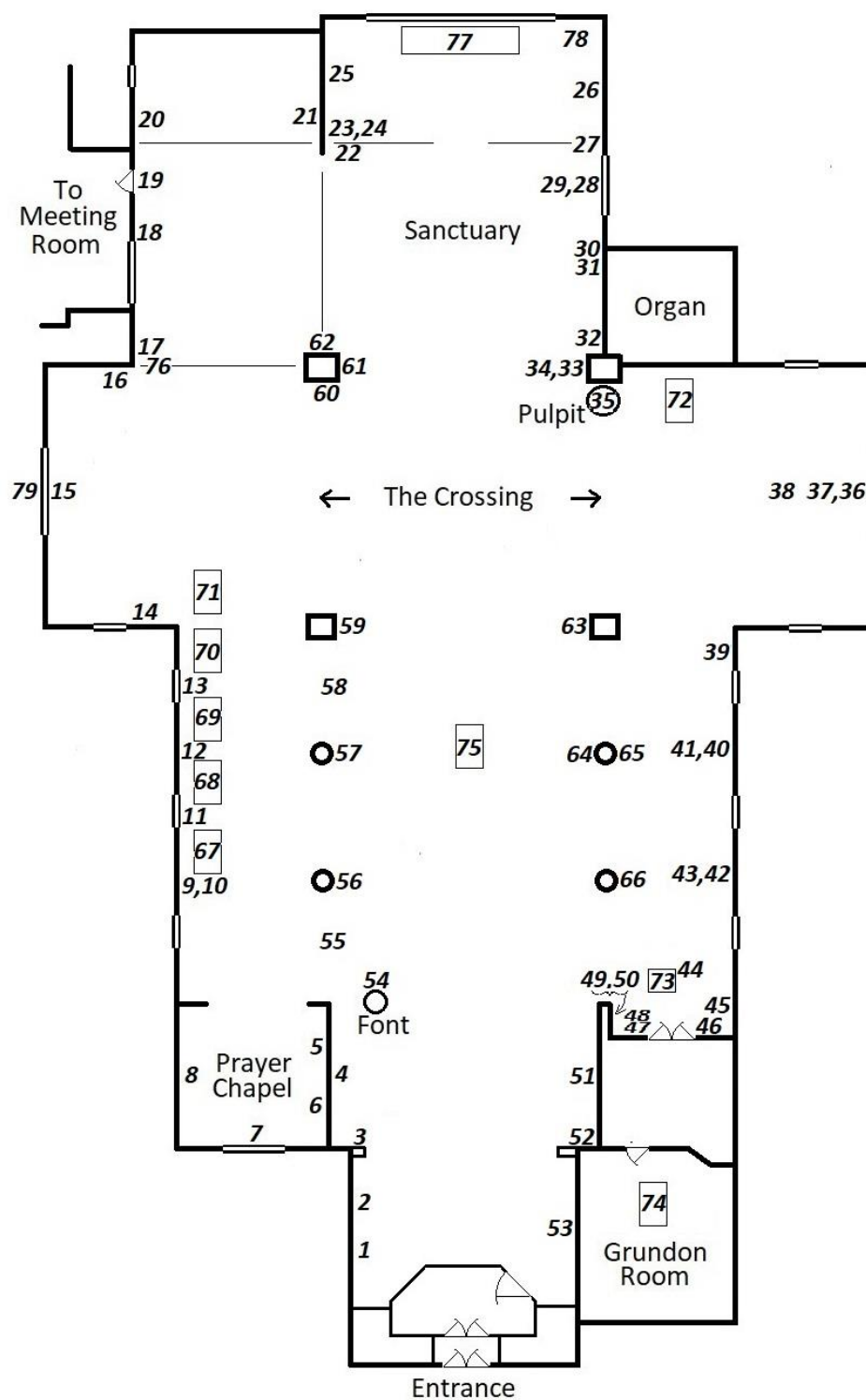
LAYOUT OF THE MEMORIALS

Under heading of 'Note': There is in the Chapter House of Worcester Cathedral an ancient document written in black letter upon a parchment scroll and dated AD 1247, by which the Abbey of Evesham expressed its willingness to give over the Parish of Hillingdon to WALTER Bishop of Worcester and his successors - The Pope sanctioned the transfer but it was not acted upon by the then Bishop of Worcester. In AD 1281 his successor GODFREY made his claim before the Consistory Court of London and became Rector of Hillingdon. At the same time provision was made by a deed for the appointment of a Vicar to be maintained out of Church lands tithes and other oblations of the Parish, and for the building of a Vicarage House, the presentation to the Vicarage being reserved to the Bishop of London and his successors for ever. The Bishops of Worcester therefore became successively Rectors of Hillingdon from 1281 to 1855. By a deed dated 27th January 1855 the then Bishop of Worcester transferred to J. B. SLADEN all that Capital Messuage or Rectory of Hillingdon with the lands held therewith with the exception of 120 acres or thereabouts: and the premises comprised in this exception were transferred to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners as from 24th June 1855, under the provisions of an Order in Council gazetted 28th September 1855.

The memorial does not have an inscription on it, but the following notice explains this memorial to the visitor: "On the left is a memorial to JOHN, 8th Lord STRANGE, Baron of Knokyn (Shropshire), 1444 - 1479; and his wife JACQUETTA. She was the sister of ELIZABETH WOODVILLE, who was Queen of EDWARD IV & mother of the famous young 'Princes in the Tower'. Their daughter JANE had a tomb made in 1509 for them in the chancel (near the altar), long since removed. This marble slab with brass memorial was originally the top of it, and when JANE was herself buried in it in 1513,

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her figure was added between theirs. Of all the brasses in this church this is the most famous, said to be the best of its kind in Greater London to survive from the medieval period."
