Dusan Lajovic | Age: 35 | World No. 116 | Career-High No. 23 | 2026: 1-2 (Rio 2R) | Santiago: 2-1 (2023 QF)

> Achieved career-high No. 23 after defeating future World No. 1 Medvedev to reach 1st ATP Tour singles final at 2019 ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo.

> Entered Monte-Carlo as World No. 48 and became lowest-ranked finalist at that event since No. 53 Aranzi in 2001.

> Captured 2nd title at 2023 Banja Luka by defeating over No. 1 Djokovic in QF for biggest win of career and No. 6 Rublev in final, becoming 1st player to post 2 Top 10 wins en route to clay ATP 250 title in series history (since 2009).

> Won 1st ATP Tour singles title at 2019 Umag, doubles title at 2015 Istanbul w/Albot and team title at 2020 ATP Cup as member of Team Serbia.

> Advanced to Grand Slam 4R on 2 occasions: 2014 Roland Garros and 2021 Australian Open.

> Qualified 16 times at ATP Masters 1000 events, including en route to 2018 Madrid QF.

NOTE: Lajovic seeks second ATP Tour win of the season after defeating Altmaier in Rio 1R last week. Serbian is 3-19 vs. Germans on tour-level, breaking a 14-match losing streak against them last week with win over Altmaier. He is the only Serbian in the field after defending champion Djere withdrew due to left tibia stress.

Yannick Hanfmann | Age: 34 | World No. 81 | Career-High No. 45 | 2026: 3-2 (2x 2R) | Santiago: 5-4 (2022-23 QF)
> Hearing-impaired player broke into Top 100 in 2018 and achieved career-high No. 45 in July 2023 after biggest win of career vs. No. 5 Tsitsipas at 2023 Mallorca en route to 6th of 9 ATP Tour SFs.
> Earned wins over No. 9 Fritz and No. 6 Rublev to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2023 Rome and as World No. 101 became lowest-ranked quarter-finalist in Rome since No. 114 Monaco in 2016.
> Qualified en route to 1st ATP Tour final at 2017 Gstaad and 2nd final at 2020 Kitzbuhel.
> Captured 1st Top 10 win of career over No. 9 Monfils at 2020 Hamburg, where he accepted main draw WC instead of playing qualifying at Roland Garros.
> Posted 1st Grand Slam main draw win in 7th try at 2022 Australian Open as Q (d. Kokkinakis).
> Captured 7 Challenger titles after playing for University of Southern California (2012-15), where he helped Trojans win 2 NCAA national titles.

NOTE: Hanfmann is making his fifth consecutive appearance in Santiago, highlighted by QFs in 2022 (l. to Martinez) and 2023 (l. to Jarry), losing to eventual champions in both. He is 8-1 vs. players ranked outside Top 50 on tour-level since September, lone loss to No. 78 J. Cerundolo in Rio de Janeiro 2R last week.

[Q] Andrea Pellegrino (ITA) vs [Q] Alex Barrena (ARG)

First Meeting

Andrea Pellegrino | Age: 28 | World No. 137 | Career-High No. 126 | 2026: 0-1 (Buenos Aires 1R) | Santiago: 0-0 ('23-'24 Q1)
> Achieved career-high No. 126 in September 2025 after run to 12th Challenger final in Genoa.
> Qualified for 2020 Sardinia and earned 4-6 7-6(7) 3-0 RET win in his ATP Tour debut over Travaglia in 1R, saving 2 MPs and defeated Faria for 2nd ATP Tour win at 2025 Bastad, squandering 5 MPs vs. Griekspoor in 2R.
> Upset No. 19 Auger-Aliassime en route to 2025 Estoril CH final for biggest win of career.
> Won ATP Tour doubles title at 2023 Santiago w/Vavassori, saving 1 MP in the final against Seyboth Wild/Soto.
> Owns 160-165 record on ATP Challenger Tour (4-8 in finals), picking up titles at 2021 Rome-1, 2022 Vicenza, 2023 Bad Waltersdorf, and 2025 Perugia.
> Peaked at No. 27 in juniors, appearing at all four Grand Slams and recording wins over future Top 10 players Hurkacz and Tsitsipas.

NOTE: Pellegrino earned wins over Villalon and Galan to qualify for his second ATP Tour event of 2026 (Buenos Aires, l. to Etcheverry in 1R). 28-year-old seeks third tour-level win after defeating countryman Travaglia at 2020 Sardinia and Faria in Bastad last July. At this venue, won lone ATP Tour title in doubles in 2023 w/Vavassori.

Alex Barrena | Age: 23 | World No. 183 | Career-High No. 170 | 2026: 0-1 (Buenos Aires 1R) | Santiago: 0-0 (Debut)
> Former Top 30 junior earned 1st ranking point in 2021, broke into Top 500 in 2023 and Top 200 at career-high No. 170 in September 2025 following back-to-back Challenger finals in Villa Maria and Buenos Aires.
> Made ATP Tour debut at 2026 Buenos Aires as WC and qualified for 2026 Santiago two weeks later.
> Entered Grand Slam qualifying at 2025 US Open (l. to Coppejans in 3 sets) and 2026 Australian Open (l. to Boyer in 3 sets).
> Owns 43-35 Challenger record (2-2 in finals), capturing titles at 2025 San Miguel de Tucuman and 2025 Santa Cruz de la Sierra, posting 32-15 record in 2025.
> Peaked at No. 24 in juniors in 2020 following his run to Roland Garros boys' singles quarter-final (l. to Riedi).

NOTE: Barrena did not drop a set to qualify for Santiago debut, defeating Nunez and Gaubas and now seeks 1st ATP Tour win (0-1) after losing to Kopriva in Buenos Aires 1R two weeks ago. He bids to be the lowest-ranked player to earn a main draw win at this event since No. 264 Pucinelli De Almeida in 2022 (d. Rune in 1R).

[7] Francisco Comesana (ARG) vs Pedro Martinez (ESP)

Comesana Leads 1-0

25 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid (Spain) Clay R128 Francisco Comesana 6-4 6-4

Francisco Comesana | Age: 25 | World No. 82 | Career-High No. 54 | 2026: 2-5 (2 times in 2R) | Santiago: 1-2 ('25 2R)
> Broke into Top 200 in June 2023, Top 100 in April 2024 and achieved career-high No. 54 in August 2025 after his run to 4R of ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati.
> In Grand Slam main draw debut at 2024 Wimbledon, defeated No. 6 Rublev in 1R for 1st tour-level win of care and beat Walton in 2R to become youngest Argentine in Wimbledon 3R since del Potro in 2011.
> Reached 2024 US Open 3R to become 3rd Argentine man in Open Era to advance to 3R in 1st two Grand Slam main draw appearances after Jaite (in 1984-85) and Markus (in 1991).

- > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF and SF at 2025 Rio de Janeiro, defeating No. 2 Zverev for biggest win of career in QF.
- > Posted 45-21 Challenger record in 2023, earning most Challenger wins that season, highlighted by titles in Vicenza and Liberec and finals in Skopje and Santa Cruz

NOTE: Comesana seeks first ATP Tour win during this year's Golden Swing after 1R losses in Buenos Aires (to Ugo Carabelli) and Rio de Janeiro (to Etcheverry) after his run to Rio SF last year (d. No. 2 Zverev in QF). He is playing in Santiago main draw for the third consecutive season, defeating No. 193 Meligeni Alves in 1R last year for 1st win.

Pedro Martinez | Age: 28 | World No. 101 | Career-High No. 36 | 2026: 2-4 (Buenos Aires QF) | Santiago: 7-3 ('22 Title)
> Broke into Top 50 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2022 Santiago in February and Top 40 in May 2022, before achieving career-high No. 36 in February 2025.
> Defeated No. 16 Bautista Agut at 2021 Kitzbuhel en route to 1st SF and final and No. 8 Ruud for biggest win of career en route to 2024 Estoril final.
> Led all players by qualifying for 6 tour-level events in 2020, including Australian Open, Rio de Janeiro, Rome and Roland Garros.
> Also in 2020, earned 1st tour-level win at Australian Open (d. Koepfer), posted 1st ATP Masters 1000 win at Rome (d. Querrey) and advanced to 1st Grand Slam 3R at Roland Garros.
> Reached 8 of his 14 career Challenger finals on home clay in Spain, highlighted by 2020 Marbella, 2021 Seville, 2023 Maspalomas, 2024 Girona and 2024 Valencia titles.

NOTE: Martinez is one of 4 former champions in the field (also Baez, Garin, Jarry), winning his lone ATP Tour title in 2022 (d. Baez), also advancing to 2024 SF (l. to Baez) and losing to eventual champion Djere in 2R last year. He earned both ATP Tour wins in 2026 en route to Buenos Aires QF over Argentinians Midon and J. Cerundolo.

[WC] Nicolas Jarry (CHI) vs [Q] Dino Prizmic (CRO)

First Meeting

Nicolas Jarry | Age: 30 | World No. 155 | Career-High No. 16 | 2026: 0-0 | Santiago: 6-4 (2023 Title)
> Unranked to begin 2021, achieved career-high No. 16 in May 2024 after becoming 1st Chilean since Gonzalez in 2007 to reach ATP Masters 1000 final in Rome.
> In 2023, rallied from a set down three times in five matches to win his 2nd ATP Tour title in his hometown of Santiago and upset former champions Ruud and Zverev en route to Geneva title.
> Joined countryman Garin as fellow 2019 first-time ATP Tour champion by winning Bastad title without losing a set.
> Saved 1 MP vs. No. 3 A. Zverev in 2019 Barcelona 2R for 1st Top 3 win of career, but squandered 2 MPs vs. A. Zverev in Geneva final one month later.
> Advanced to Grand Slam 4Rs at 2023 Roland Garros (d. No. 17 Paul in 2R) and 2025 Wimbledon, after coming from 2 sets to 0 down for first time in career to defeat No. 8 Rune in Wimbledon 1R.
> Peaked at No. 8 in junior rankings after advancing to 2013 Roland Garros boys' doubles final with countryman Garin.

NOTE: Santiago-native Jarry is playing in his first tour-level event since US Open and seeks first tour-level win since defeating Fonseca to reach Wimbledon 4R last July (0-5 since). Making his sixth consecutive appearance at the event, highlighted by rallying from a set down in QF, SF and final to win 2023 title. 30-year-old is playing on the court named after his grandfather, Jaime Fillol Sr., former World No. 14 (in 1974).

Dino Prizmic | Age: 20 | World No. 120 | Career-High No. 115 | 2026: 2-2 (2 times in 1R) | Santiago: 0-0 (Debut)
> Former World No. 8 junior earned first ranking point in March 2022, broke Top 200 in August 2023 and achieved career-high No. 115 in September 2025 before qualifying for Next Gen ATP Finals later that season.
> Made ATP Tour debut at 2022 Umag as a WC and returned to Umag to advance to his 1st ATP Tour QFs, losing to eventual champions Popyrin in 2023 and Darderi in 2025.
> Earned biggest win of career over No. 30 Lehecka in 2023 Stockholm 1R as Q.
> Qualified to make Grand Slam main draw debut at 2024 Australian Open, losing to his idol Djokovic in 1R, and entered 2025 US Open as Q and 2026 Australian Open as LL.
> Owns 65-38 Challenger record (3-3 in finals), reaching 4 consecutive finals from May-July 2025 and capturing titles in Zagreb and Bratislava.
> Became the first Croat since Cilic in 2005 to win the boys' singles event at 2023 Roland Garros.

NOTE: Prizmic defeated Heide and H. Dellien to qualify in back-to-back weeks after Rio de Janeiro last week (l. to Passaro in 1R). 20-year-old looks for first ATP Tour win on clay since his run to Umag QF in July last year and bids to be first Croatian and fifth-youngest match winner in tournament history at 20 years and 6 months.
