\* **Sr 26**, Florida Forest Service. Five miles east of Gainesville, FL. Southern rough. Extreme fire behavior with running and long-range spotting. Structures threatened. Road closures in effect.

\* **Appalachia**, Cherokee NF, USFS. Eight miles north of Ducktown, TN. Timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and backing. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

**Sargent**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile south of Sargent, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

\* **Jericho Rd**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Nine miles west of Newton, GA. Hardwood litter. Extreme fire behavior with crowning and wind-driven runs. Residences threatened.

**Woodbury**, South Carolina Forestry Commission. Ten miles east of Hemingway, SC. Southern rough and timber. Moderate fire behavior with group torching. Residences threatened.

**Rafey**, Alabama Forestry Commission. Thirty-three miles north of Citronelle, AL. Brush. Active fire behavior.

**STE Alum**, Daniel Boone NF, USFS. Three miles west of Whitley City, KY. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Rosindale Road**, North Carolina Forest Service. Eight miles north of Lake Waccamaw, NC. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering.

**Newman Dr**, Florida Forest Service. Twelve miles northeast of Naples, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, backing and short-range spotting.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

A storm will continue to move through the northern and central Rockies today bringing widespread precipitation and lowering snow levels, with precipitation spreading onto the northern Plains tonight. Breezy west to southwest winds 15-25 mph with gusts to 35 mph amid relative humidity of 7-20% will develop ahead of this storm across southern New Mexico to the southern and central High Plains today creating elevated to locally critical conditions. A dissipating cold front will move through the Ohio Valley, Lower Great Lakes, and Northeast with scattered showers and thunderstorms. Dry conditions will persist on the east slopes of the Appalachians into the Southeast with minimum relative humidity of 15-30%, and localized southwest winds 10-18 mph will create areas of elevated conditions. Cold temperatures and occasional showers will continue across the southern two-thirds of Alaska, while sea breezes and isolated showers are expected in Hawai'i.
